## GET STUCK ON ART

## Sculpting Puppets With Duck Tape®

Materials: newspaper; found objects (soda bottles, cardboard tubes, etc.); a variety of Duck Tape® rolls and sheets; scissors; broomsticks

- Introduce students to large-scale puppetry and discuss uses in performance and culture such as the Bread and Puppet Theater, Chinese New Year, Day of the Dead, etc. More information available at www.scholastic.com/ducktapeart.
- 2. Explain to students that they will make a large-scale puppet head by using Duck Tape® and other lightweight materials to sculpt a character in much the same way that traditional papier-mâché and casting materials (paper, water, glue, fabric, plaster, wire, etc.) have been used historically.
- Encourage students to create an original character with ridiculous and exaggerated facial characteristics to maximize artistic impact and

construction of arms, legs, and other body parts, as well as clothing/costumes made from Duck Tape\*. Challenge students to write a script and create a full-scale performance using their puppets as characters in a story relevant to current events, or as part of a school or

other celebration.




## **HOW-TO**


**1. Plan, sketch, and gather**— invent a character and sketch its head, straight on and in profile; gather materials to incorporate into the sculpture.



**2. Build components**—crumple and shape newspaper into a head, ears, nose, etc.; wrap shapes in standard (gray) Duck Tape®.



**3. Construct and paint**—connect all pieces of the head together and "paint" different features with different colors of Duck Tape\*.



4. Add details and mount—
cut eyes, mouth, etc. from Duck Tape®
sheets and affix to face; cut an "X"
in bottom of head and insert
broomstick to mount.
